

Old Testament Law And The New Testament Christian
Luke 6:1-11

Proverbs 23:23 – Get the truth and never sell it; also get wisdom, discipline, and good judgment. (NLT)

Luke 6:1-11 – ¹On a Sabbath, he passed through the grainfields. His disciples were picking heads of grain, rubbing them in their hands, and eating them. ²But some of the Pharisees said, “Why are you doing what is not lawful on the Sabbath?” ³Jesus answered them, “Haven’t you read what David and those who were with him did when he was hungry— ⁴how he entered the house of God and took and ate the bread of the Presence, which is not lawful for any but the priests to eat? He even gave some to those who were with him.” ⁵Then he told them, “The Son of Man is Lord of the Sabbath.” ⁶On another Sabbath he entered the synagogue and was teaching. A man was there whose right hand was shriveled. ⁷The scribes and Pharisees were watching him closely, to see if he would heal on the Sabbath, so that they could find a charge against him. ⁸But he knew their thoughts and told the man with the shriveled hand, “Get up and stand here.” So he got up and stood there. ⁹Then Jesus said to them, “I ask you: Is it lawful to do good on the Sabbath or to do evil, to save life or to destroy it?” ¹⁰After looking around at them all, he told him, “Stretch out your hand.” He did, and his hand was restored. ¹¹They, however, were filled with rage and started discussing with one another what they might do to Jesus. (CSB)

I. Personal needs outweigh **rituals** and **rules**.

Colossians 2:16-17 – ¹⁶Therefore, don't let anyone judge you in regard to food and drink or in the matter of a festival or a new moon or a Sabbath day. ¹⁷These are a shadow of what was to come; the substance is Christ. (CSB)

II. Some laws are **temporal** some are **universal**.

Matthew 22:36-39 – ³⁶“Teacher, which command in the law is the greatest?” ³⁷He said to him, “Love the Lord your God with all your heart, with all your soul, and with all your mind. ³⁸This is the greatest and most important command. ³⁹The second is like it: Love your neighbor as yourself. (CSB)

III. Jesus has become our **Sabbath's rest**.

Hebrews 4:9-11 – ⁹Therefore, a Sabbath rest remains for God's people. ¹⁰For the person who has entered his rest has rested from his own works, just as God did from his. ¹¹Let us then make every

effort to enter that rest, so that no one will fall into the same pattern of disobedience. (CSB)

Hebrews 8:6 – But Jesus has now obtained a superior ministry, and to that degree he is the mediator of a better covenant, which has been established on better promises. (CSB)
