

Keys to Radical Discipleship (Part 2)

Luke 6:37-49

I. Live like **Jesus**. (v. 40)

2 Corinthians 3:18 – We all, with unveiled faces, are looking as in a mirror at the glory of the Lord and are being transformed into the same image from glory to glory; this is from the Lord who is the Spirit. (CSB)

Matthew 15:14 – Leave them alone! They are blind guides. And if the blind guide the blind, both will fall into a pit. (CSB)

II. Will you choose to be **forgiving** or **critical**? (v. 37-38)

Titus 3:3-7 – ³For we too were once foolish, disobedient, deceived, enslaved by various passions and pleasures, living in malice and envy, hateful, detesting one another. ⁴But when the kindness of God our Savior and his love for mankind appeared, ⁵he saved us—not by works of righteousness that we had done, but according to his mercy—through the washing of regeneration and renewal by the Holy Spirit. ⁶He poured out his Spirit on us abundantly through Jesus Christ our Savior ⁷so that, having been justified by his grace, we may become heirs with the hope of eternal life. (CSB)

III. Will you choose to be **authentic** or an **imposter**? (v. 39-42)

Romans 14:4 – Who are you to judge another's household servant? Before his own Lord he stands or falls. And he will stand, because the Lord is able to make him stand. (CSB)

Romans 14:13 – Therefore, let us no longer judge one another. Instead decide never to put a stumbling block or pitfall in the way of your brother or sister. (CSB)

James 4:12 – There is one lawgiver and judge who is able to save and to destroy. But who are you to judge your neighbor? (CSB)

IV. Will you choose to be **fresh** or **spoiled**? (v. 43-45)

1 Peter 2:12 – Conduct yourselves honorably among the Gentiles, so that when they slander you as evildoers, they will observe your good works and will glorify God on the day he visits. (CSB)

V. Will you choose **security** or **destruction**? (v. 46-49)

Proverbs 28:26 – The one who trusts in himself is a fool, but one who walks in wisdom will be safe. (CSB)

Proverbs 11:5 – The righteousness of the blameless clears his path, but the wicked person will fall because of his wickedness. (CSB)
