

The Miracle of God in You

Luke 8:40-56

I. We don't see miracles as often as it **appears** to be so in the Bible.

A. The **Old Testament** saints lived by faith in the present by looking in the past and hoping for the future.

Psalm 77:11 – I will remember the deeds of the Lord; yes, I will remember your miracles of long ago. (NIV)

B. The **New Testament saints** lived by faith in the present by looking in the past and hoping for the future.

John 10:37 – Don't believe me unless I carry out my Father's work. (NLT)

II. There are probably more miracles happening today than we realize.

III. Our faith is not in today, it is in the promise of the coming age.

IV. There is always a God-given purpose and place for miracles.

A. God can work outside or within the natural realm to bring about a miracle.

Colossians 1:17- He is before all things, and by him all things hold together. (CSB)

B. God's miracle work is in you every moment of every day.

Galatians 3:3-6 – ³Are you so foolish? After beginning by the Spirit, are you now finishing by the flesh? ⁴Did you experience so much for nothing—if in fact it was for nothing? ⁵So then, does God give you the Spirit and work miracles among you by your doing the works of the law? Or is it by believing what you heard— ⁶just like Abraham who believed God, and it was credited to him for righteousness? (CSB)

The miracle of the work of the Holy Spirit in you.

1. You don't **earn miracles** by doing good.
2. **Faith** is the grounds for our experiencing of the Holy Spirit in our lives.
3. God promises to supply His Spirit, **continually**.
